

Associate of Arts Articulation Agreement between
Seattle College District
And
Troy University

To create a clear and easy pathway for students of the Seattle College District (SCD), consisting of North Seattle College, South Seattle College and Seattle Central College, to transfer to and complete their baccalaureate degree at Troy University (TROY), this transfer agreement outlines transfer requirements, provisions, and related advertising considerations. This agreement does not guarantee admission to the university or to the specific program/major.

1. Decisions made by regulatory agencies such as the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools – Commission on Colleges (SACS - COC), the Alabama Department of Education, the Alabama Commission on Higher Education (ACHE), or special accrediting agencies may require changes be made to this agreement.
2. SCD members and TROY must retain its regional accreditation.
3. The attached transfer matrix identifies SCD courses acceptable to TROY.
4. Upon completion of the Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) degree at the Seattle Colleges, students will be accepted by TROY at junior status with 90 quarter transfer credits (60 semester hours). Transferring students must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or C. Courses numbered lower than 100-level are not included in this transfer agreement.
5. Transfer of more than 90 quarter credits (60 semester hours) will be considered on a course by course basis. Any semester hours beyond 60 will be reviewed on a course by course basis. This credit hour review and acceptance will be determined by Troy University. Courses with a grade lower than C- or 1.6 will not transfer.
6. Transferability of CLEP, DANTES, advanced placement credit and/or other non-traditional credit is subject to approval by TROY.

7. Students from SCD who wish to transfer to TROY must be in good standing at SCD.
8. TROY defines a transfer student as one who has a minimum GPA of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale) on at least 24 semester hours of college credit attempted excluding developmental courses. Those meeting this requirement may be admitted to TROY unconditionally.
9. Prospective TROY students must be admitted to TROY before transfer credit will be awarded. Transfer credit will not be awarded until prospective TROY students
 - a. Meet eligibility requirements for admission and registration to TROY,
 - b. Complete and submit an Application for Admission,
 - c. Pay the Admission Fee, and
 - d. Submit official transcripts and other required documents.
10. Successful completion of SCD Associate degree denotes completion of TROY's General Studies requirements for Areas I-IV and the University technology requirement and University success course requirement in Area V. Course requirements for specific majors, including those located in Area V, must be met through appropriate classes taken at SCD or at TROY. All prerequisite requirements for TROY classes must be met.
11. All students must earn a minimum of 50% of all degree program hours on a senior college level in order to graduate from TROY with a bachelor's degree.
12. International students who complete ENG 101 and ENG 102 with a grade of 2.0 or higher will have met the English proficiency requirements of TROY, and will not need to submit separate proof of English proficiency at the time of application.
13. SCD and TROY may choose to co-develop written materials outlining for SCD students programs, policies and procedures relevant to this agreement. This agreement will be publicized in newsletters, course schedules and other promotional materials.

This agreement will remain in effect until a mutually agreed-upon change is deemed necessary and may be terminated by the SCD or TROY with appropriate written notification. Each institution agrees to provide termination notice one year prior to intended change.

SCD and TROY officially authorize this agreement on ____ Day of _____, 20____, with the agreement becoming effective immediately.
