We are currently in the process of hiring a Student Leader at South Seattle College and look forward to introducing them soon!

Here's what we accomplished in Winter...

Accepted referrals & appointments – Thank you to all the staff who have used Starfish to refer students to Funding Navigation! We received 65 Starfish referrals and met with over 200 students.

Provided FAFSA/WASFA assistance – Via both one-on-one appointments and in weekly virtual workshops, Funding Navigators helped **207 students** submit a financial aid application in Winter term.

Offered targeted retention support – With Seattle Promise, Funding Navigators co-facilitated workshops to support students whose financial aid is at risk of suspension due to not meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). Navigators also engaged in an outreach campaign to enrolled students with incomplete aid applications, personally calling over **120 students** to encourage them to complete their process.

Provided re-enrollment support – to **twelve** North Seattle students with past-due balances who were offered a Commitment Scholarship, helping them identify funding for future quarters

Hosted collaborative workshops and class visits – with Project Baldwin, Career Link, Welcome Center, Workforce Education, AANAPISI, TRiO, and others to help connect more students with funding opportunities.

Lots to look forward to this Spring

Funding Navigators will continue to host **virtual FAFSA/WASFA workshops** every Tuesday at noon via Zoom. Students learn the basics of FAFSA/WASFA and then have the option to receive one-on-one support via breakout rooms, if needed.

Throughout April and May, we're hosting a series of **student focus groups** to learn more about the student experience and specific funding-related barriers students face. To draw out the unique experiences of our multilingual students, we are working with ECE at North to host focus groups in languages other than English. Funding Navigators are working with ABE/ESL and high school reengagement programs to **connect with transitional studies students** through class visits and workshops. Interested in partnering with us to reach these students? Contact <u>morial.shistle@seattlecolleges.edu</u>

A cross-functional team is **developing a screening tool** to help students identify what funding sources they are eligible for, how to get started, and where they can go for support. We're consulting with Financial Aid, Workforce, and students throughout this process.
