Tim Wise, KEYNOTE ADDRESS



Tim Wise is a leading anti-racist writer and educator, with more than 25 years of experience speaking at colleges, conferences, and community groups nationwide. He has provided anti-racism training to professionals in corporate, government, entertainment, media, law enforcement, military, and medical industries, both in the U.S. and internationally.

As the author of nine books, including "Dispatches from the Race War," Wise explores topics such as racial inequality, privilege, and the impact of racism on society. His involvement in social justice extends to his advisory role at the Fisk University Race Relations Institute and his past work with the Louisiana Coalition Against Racism and Nazism. He has also been featured in documentaries, including "White Like Me" and "The Great White Hoax," and has participated in public dialogues on issues of race, class, gender, and militarism.
