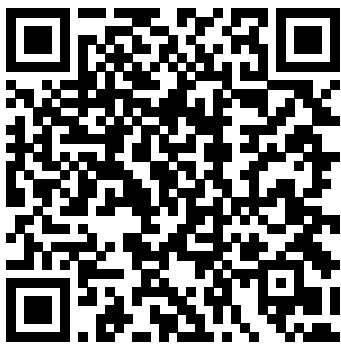

- Credits are applied to your college transcript during the summer.
- You can request a copy of your official or unofficial transcript from the South Seattle College website.
- Use your ctcLink ID number to log in to the ctcLink website and view your academic record.

- Send an official transcript to your college of choice to transfer your Seattle Colleges credits.
- If you earned credits from more than one Seattle Colleges campus, request and send a transcript from each campus.
