This pathway meets requirements for the Associate of Arts (AA) degree with an emphasis in Social Justice and Equity. You'll learn about intersecting systems of oppression and exploitation and how people organize and resist these systems. You'll learn about the histories and resistance struggles of Black, Indigenous, and people of color; the poor and working classes; immigrants; women; LGBTQ+ people; disabled people; and young people.

Students in this pathway develop skills in oral and written communication, critical thinking and problem solving, systems analysis, research design and planning, digital technology, collaboration, leadership, and intercultural fluency.


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
